This position is also responsible for coordinating and implementing various events related to student and staff participation throughout the year.

**EDUCATION AND/OR EXPERIENCE:** Must possess a valid Louisiana teaching certificate pertinent to teaching assignment. Must have a Bachelor's degree in Elementary Education or a Bachelor's degree in High School education (7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>) with highly qualified credentials toward designated subject area for 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> teaching position.
