This course will present an overview of Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) for offenses committed by non-Tribal individuals on Tribal lands. Tribal Court jurisdiction to issue and enforce protective orders against non-Indians for exclusion from Indian land and state registry of protective orders. Tribal Law and Order Act (TLOA) and enhanced sentencing penalties provisions associated with same and Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA). Review of tribal, federal and state statutes, codes, ordinances and sentencing authorities.

Why should I take this course?

This course covers training for enhancement of Tribal judicial practices and provide essential elements of implementing the Violence Against Women Act for jurisdiction of non-Tribal individuals, Tribal Law and Order Act and Indian Child Welfare Act cases.

Tribal and State Court Judges, Court Administrators or Court Clerks, Prosecutors, Public Defenders, Chief of Police and Police Officers, and State Officials.
